RECYCLING PROGRAM REMINDER

It is mandatory to recycle. In an effort to reduce the volume of Ida County waste being landfilled, Ida County and the cities in the county have passed ordinances prohibiting the disposal of any recyclables in the landfill. Your haulers will pick-up the recyclables below or you can bring them to the Ida County Sanitation Center.



WE ALL NEED TO DO OUR PART TO RECYCLE. Remember: Rinse all containers, tin cans, and plastics only.



Paper and flattened cardboard bundled separately. Newspapers in a paper grocery sack.

Set out on dry days only.

	WE ACCEPT	WE DO <u>NOT</u> ACCEPT
<p>CANS</p>	<p>All aluminum and tin food and beverage cans. Examples: soft drink, beer and juice cans; tuna beans, fruit, and vegetable cans.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ <u>Empty and rinse</u> all cans. ▪ Labels are okay. ▪ Place lid inside the rinsed can. <p>Disposable aluminum foil containers. Examples: balled foil wrap, foil pie plates, aluminum pans, lasagna trays, and foil TV dinner trays.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Rinse all foil products. ▪ Crumple or ball aluminum containers and foil. 	<p><u>NOT RECYCLABLE</u></p> <p>Metal pots and pans, kitchen appliances, furniture, furnace filters and aluminum siding.</p>
<p>PLASTIC JUGS</p>	<p>Clear and colored plastic with a recycling symbol. Examples: milk jugs, soft drink and juice bottles; detergent and bleach bottles.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ <u>Empty and rinse</u> all jugs and bottles. ▪ <u>Flatten</u> all milk jugs and detergent bottles. ▪ Throw away all lids. 	
<p>CARDBOARD</p>	<p>Corrugated cardboard boxes – the type of cardboard with two layers of paper surrounding an inner layer of fluted/wavy paper.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Remove all contents. ▪ <u>Flatten</u> all boxes ▪ If several pieces, tie with light string into bundle. ▪ Place cardboard bundle on top of the bin weighted down by bagged or bundled newspaper. 	<p><u>NOT RECYCLABLE</u></p> <p>Waxed paper, milk and juice cartons.</p>

<p>NEWSPAPERS, OFFICE PAPER, MAGAZINES AND CATALOGS, AND JUNK MAIL</p> 	<p>Newspapers (including all inserts), phone books, magazines, catalogs, office paper (white and pastel bond paper, all computer paper, copy machine paper, white and pastel envelopes, white and pastel forms, yellow legal pad paper, tablet and note pad paper, fax paper, newspapers, file folders), boxboard containers (cereal boxes, gift boxes, shoe boxes and envelope boxes), and junk mail (including window envelopes).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Remove all plastic liners and paper from boxboard containers and <u>flatten the boxes.</u> ▪ All the above paper products may be mixed and put into a paper sack or bundled. ▪ Paper clips and rubber bands do not have to be removed. ▪ Steel clips in the file folders must be removed. ▪ <u>Set out only on dry days</u> – if it is raining, please hold paper items until next recycling day. ▪ Place bagged or bundled paper products on top of or beside your recycling bin. ▪ Do <u>not</u> place paper products loose in your recycling bin. ▪ Please put all newspapers in a paper grocery sack. 	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>NOT RECYCLABLE</u></p> <p>Hardcover books, carbon paper, food wrappers and containers, plastic and all other non-paper items, thermal fax paper, wax paper, tissue paper and wood products.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>RECYCLABLE</u></p> <p>If hardcovers are removed from books, then recycle pages.</p>
<p>GLASS</p> 		<p>We do not accept any glass items. Please just put all of those with your regular trash.</p>

Now that you know what is recyclable, here's how to place the material into your bin:

1. Place aluminum products, tin cans and plastic jugs (co-mingled items) in the bottom of the recycling bin.
2. Place corrugated cardboard bundles on top of the bin weighted down by bagged or bundled paper products.
3. **DO NOT mix paper products with co-mingled items.**
