Did you know Holstein provides a dedicated yard waste site for residents? You can drop off leaves, grass clippings, and small branches at the lagoon disposal site. Please remember — no trash, cans, bottles, or household waste is allowed. This helps keep the site safe, clean, and available for everyone.

🏲 Lawn & Property Care Rules

City ordinance requires that grass and weeds be kept under 9 inches on all properties, occupied or vacant. If your grass exceeds that height, the city may mow it for you — but at a cost of \$50/hour plus a \$75 surcharge. Regular mowing keeps Holstein's neighborhoods looking their best.


